ACTIVITIES

OUTPUTS

SHORT TERM OBJECTIVES 

- Young people from low SES communities, and those with high percentages of Culturally & Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds have an increased understanding of legal issues that disproportionately affect them.
- TalkLaw® immersive learning experiences inspire young people to think broadly in terms of their own career aspirations.

LONG TERM OBJECTIVES 

- The legal information provided to young people filters to families and communities, contributing to increased awareness of the legal topics covered in the TalkLaw® program.
- Young people avoid legal problems in relation to the topics covered in the TalkLaw® program in future.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS **In NSW, VIC & WA volunteers are required to:**

- hold a valid WWCC.
- commit to attending half of the scheduled sessions.
- comply with any other child protection requirements of the school.

In QLD volunteers are required to:

- attend two of the scheduled sessions.
- comply with any other child protection requirements of the school.

All volunteers are required to:

- attend a training session before conducting the program

- Feedback sought from schools, KWM and client volunteers at the conclusion of every program.
